Notice Regarding Postponement of Announcement of Consolidated Financial Results for the Fiscal Year Ended March 31, 2020

Nitta Gelatin Inc. (hereinafter "Nitta Gelatin") hereby announces that due to the impact of the COVID-19 outbreak it has decided to postpone the announcement of its consolidated financial results for the fiscal year ended March 31, 2020, which had been planned for Thursday, May 14, 2020.

1. Reason for Postponing the Announcement

Nitta Gelatin group is expected to face delays in duties related to the consolidated financial statements due to the impact of the COVID-19 outbreak on some of its overseas subsidiaries (a lockdown has been enforced throughout India until May 3). Nitta Gelatin decided to postpone its announcement after taking this matter into account.

2. Schedule Going Forward

The date of the earnings announcement remains undecided at this moment, but will be announced promptly as soon as it has been decided.

3. Impact on Earnings Results

The impact of the COVID-19 outbreak on the Company's consolidated financial results for the fiscal year ended March 31, 2020 was negligible. At this point in time, there is no change to the consolidated financial results forecast announced on February 10, 2020, but should a revision be necessary, it will be announced promptly.

Nitta Gelatin is currently assessing the impact that the COVID-19 outbreak will have on consolidated financial results for the fiscal year ending March 31, 2021, but plans to announce this together with the financial results announcement.

The Company offers its apologies to all stakeholders, including shareholders and investors, for any inconvenience caused.
